### **Art Room News!**

Our St. Paul Bluewaves are expanding their appreciation for Art! Here is what is new in Mrs. Brunette's room! **Kindergarten**-This semester, kindergarten students learned what the word portrait meant and created their own self-portrait collages. Currently, students are working on moose collages inspired by the adorable book "Too Many Moose" by Lisa M. Bakos. In this project, kindergarten students are strengthening their cutting, tracing and gluing art skills.

**First & Second**-First & second grade students have been very busy this semester finishing lots of projects! Some of the projects students have finished this semester include: Birds on a Wire, Klimt Cats, and Wintertime Cardinals. Students have learned about the artist Gustav Klimt, created their own marble paper, texture, and continued working on their fine motor skills.

**Third & Fourth**-In Third & Fourth grade, students learned about the famous artist Gustav Klimt. As a class we discussed his artwork, particularly his love for pattern, texture and shapes. We then painted our own interpretations of Klimt's famous "Tree of Life" using fun, gold, silver and bronze metallic paints. Afterwards, students glued buttons for texture.

Currently, students are finishing up their sunset and silhouette watercolor paintings.

**Fifth & Sixth**-Fifth and Sixth grade students have also been busy completing many projects this semester. Students learned about the artist Grant Wood and his infamous American Gothic. After discussing his artwork, students looked at different parodies of American Gothic and then created their own. A parody is a humorous interpretation of a work of art, advertisement, movie or logo. In their last project, students learned about the Art Deco movement and the history of tin ceilings. Currently, fifth and sixth grade students are working on a desert landscape project using perspective.

**Seventh & Eighth Grade**-Seventh and & Eighth grade students are currently finishing their projects for the Roaring 20s Banquet next weekend. In this project, students learned about the Art Deco movement during the 1920s. After looking at various different images from the period, students created their own 3 dimensional works from 8 by 8 inch pieces of cardboard. Metallic paints were then used to decorate their designs.
