The second graders are very busy learning this year. Each child has a great journey God has designed for them. They will have some very important moments in their journey. This year, the second graders will make their First Reconciliation and their First Holy Communion. They are excited about preparing for and making these two special sacraments. They are blessed because God loves them and is showering them with gifts. They are working hard on studying prayers, reading and learning the bible and growing closer with God this year. They are doing this through prayer, listening, reflection, journaling, and sharing. They are learning about how to be the best version of themselves. They are an amazing group of faith filled children and I am blessed to teach them and guide them this year.

In Math the children are working hard on addition and subtraction facts and solving word problems. They are also using a website called MobyMax to help keep them challenged and progressing at their own individual rate. The children are also working hard on Language Arts focusing on spelling, phonics, and reading strategies. In Writing the children are working hard on using more descriptive words and expanding their thoughts. The second graders have been focusing on Plants in Science and we recently took a field trip to the Shiawassee County Fairgrounds. This was a wonderful experience for the children. We had a great leader named Ben, who took us to stations set up all throughout the barn. They learned about farming, tractors, and various crops such as soybeans and the many uses as well as milk and dairy products, corn and ethanol, and planting various plants. The children also had an opportunity to pet and learn about various farm animals such as ponies, goats, rabbits, sheep, a baby calf, and a pig. They learned how to care for them and what their diet consists of. Another highlight of the trip was riding the horse pulled carriage. The children were taught about our water. We discussed the great lakes and oceans. They learned that the majority of our earth is water. We discussed saltwater and how we can conserve water. A special thank you to the awesome parent volunteers that came with us. It was a great day of learning and hands on activities despite the heat!
