Last Day of School

As you know, we are supposed to make up two snow days at the end of the year due to the high number of snow days we had. We are required by the state to be in session a total of 180 days AND 1086 hours. Some public districts in the state are filing a request for a waiver with the Governor's office of this requirement. I have been in communication with Owosso Public Schools, and they tell me they do plan to file this waiver. When/if that waiver is approved, our school will be in the position to also file a waiver with the Superintendent's office of the Diocese. **AS SOON AS THAT PROCESS IS COMPLETE**, and an answer is received, I will be able to communicate to you what the last day of school will be. To be on the safe side, I would plan to have the children attend school through 12:10 PM on Monday, June 11. Thank you for your patience and cooperation!

5th Grade Happenings

Extra! Extra! Read all about it. Fifth graders report what is currently happening in the fifth grade.

Dylan: In reading we are learning about the parts of a poem and different types of poetry. In language arts we are working on our verb unit. We are almost done.

Dayne: In Social Studies we are studying the regions of the 13 Colonies, New England, Middle, and Southern. Some of the people we are currently learning about are William Penn, Roger Williams, John Winthrop, William Bradford, and Lord Baltimore.

Kaytlin: We start Theology off each day getting our Bibles and taking turns reading a part of the Reading, Psalm, and Gospel. Then Miss Schueller reads the daily reflection and we write about the daily reflection. We are starting a new chapter, "We Profess Our Faith."

Owen: We are doing division in math class. Right now we are learning that there can be zeros in the quotient. We use Moby Max about once a week to build our math skills.

Amelia: In science we are learning about motion. Currently we are learning about what happens when a bus or car suddenly stops. We automatically jerk forward, and that is called inertia. We do fun projects to learn about motion.

Lydia: Right now in music we are working on our song for the spring concert. We are enjoying our time together in music and are learning a lot.



Dear Parent:

We have made arrangements to acquire the GRASP program for you this **summer**. GRASP is a correspondence program for grades K to 8 which helps students **maintain reading and math skills** while they are on summer break. **What is Grasp?** The Grand Rapids Academic Summer Program is a correspondence program in reading and math for grades K-8. The program seeks to help students retain skills learned during the past school year by providing review exercises. **What is its purpose?** GRASP was written with three purposes in mind. First, to provide a cost effective alternative to the traditional summer school. Second, to provide a means by which students could maintain the recently learned essential skills in mathematics and reading. Third, to create circumstances which require students and parents to work together toward a common educational goal. **What is its format?** Each packet consists of a book of 9 lessons with one lesson to be done each week. Each lesson reinforces or reteaches the basic skills typically found in most curricula at that particular grade level. **How does it operate?** A student is enrolled in reading and/or mathematics in the grade level which they just completed. The student then is issued the appropriate book and completes one lesson per week during the summer vacation. Completed answer sheets are mailed to a scoring center where trained personnel grade the papers and the corrected answer sheet is mailed back to the student along with comments from the teacher. **What is contained in a typical packet?** A typical packet contains 9 lessons, 9 answer sheets, 9 envelopes, and complete instructions. Students in 4th-8th grades can do GRASP online. **How is the curriculum chosen?** The development staff examined local, state, and national standards which are common to most schools.

Children receive a packet of materials with a booklet containing 9 lessons. It takes approximately one hour to complete each lesson. Students complete one lesson a week or work at their own pace, as long as they submit all lessons before August 6th. They mail the lessons to GRASP where they are scored and returned to the children with comments.

We also have an on-line version of GRASP for students in 4th to 8th Grade. These students will receive feedback immediately.

Children successfully completing at least 7 lessons with 70% accuracy are awarded a certificate. Those successfully completing all 9 lessons with 70% accuracy receive a medal!

When registering, select the grade your child is just completing so they review material they learned. If your child is ahead or behind grade level, order the level that is appropriate. The fees for the summer of 2018 are \$26 for one subject or \$46 for both subjects for each child. You can enroll your child by completing the form below and paying the indicated enrollment fee.

All materials or login information will be sent home with the child by the last week of school.
