St. Paul Preschool Happenings...

Wow, it's hard to believe the Preschool year is coming to an end this week! I will miss this group of children so much. Each child has grown in leaps and bounds both, socially-emotionally, and academically. Preschool is an awesome adventure and the children learn lessons that will carry them through the rest of their school careers. Some of those lessons include; learning to cooperate with others, to wait for their turn, to regulate their emotions, and just learning how to get along in a group is huge at this age. This class has navigated through this process beautifully.

We finished the Zoo-Phonics Alphabet last month with Zeke Zebra. Zeke, by the way, is one very tired Zebra, as he has to wait so long for his turn and so of course he says, "ZZZZZZZZ". While the preschool children focus on an animal/letter a week, we learn and go over the whole Zoo-Phonics Alphabet every week. After all letters do not happen in isolation, they happen together in groups to make words. The children brought in an item each week to go along with the letter focus. They got to sit in the 'big' teacher chair at group and tell about their item. The other children who had questions would raise their hand and the child in the 'big' chair would call on those who had questions. They all loved the chance to share and be in charge for a few minutes. When we finished the alphabet with the final animal a lot the children didn't want it to be over! They had many suggestions about what we could do now that we had come to the end of the alphabet. For example, some said, "Let's do a number every week." Or "Let's make new letters." Hmmm, we could create a whole new alphabet. **This group is a very creative bunch of children!** Currently, the children are finishing a Study Unit on *Insects*. We just finished the *Reduce, Reuse, Recycle* Study Unit. I think this was one of their favorite units so far. The children made all kinds of creations out of a collection of junk, with all kinds of items that would normally go in the trash. We buried a banana peel on the playground and dug it up a couple weeks later. They discovered that it had begun to decompose. It had a paper sticker on the peel that did not decompose. This led to a discussion about garbage landfills and why it's good to reuse and recycle.
